Instrument and Determination of Meridian.

This survey was made with a 6 1/4 inch Berger transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observation, verified by Polaris observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Garnet Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by G.H. Hodges on January 21, 1906, and amended by Julius Riser and Patrick Rose, citizens of the United States the undersigned, on the Twenty-ninth day of November 1909.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and we claim 830 feet, in a southerly direction and 670 feet in a northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north to the South.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District, in Gila County, in the Territory of Arizona, about three-fourths miles in a southwesterly direction from the Live Oak mine and joins the west end of the May Day, Wedge and Hobson claims.
