Beginning at Cor No 1, the N W Cor, identical with location and with Cor No 5 Sur No 259 Owls Nest lode, and situated on line 4-1 Lot No. 40 Lucky Cuss lode at N 0° 18' E 386.6 ft from Cor No 4 and S 0° 18' W 1105.4 ft from Cor No 1,

a pine post 4 ft long 4 ins sq set 18 ins in the ground in a mound of stones and scribed 1-3218 E,

whence Cor No 4 Sur No 259 Owls Nest lode brs N 0° 18' E 164.4 ft., and the Cor to Secs 10, 11, 14 and 15, Tp 20 S, R. 22 E., G & S R B & M brs N 38° 04' W 995.2 ft.

thence S 69° 12' E

10.0 to original location for north end center, being a mound of stones 3 ft high with a 3 ft base,

20.0 to Cor No 2, the N E Cor, identical with location,

a pine post 4 ft long 4 ins sq set 18 ins in the ground in a mound of stones and scribed 2-3218 E,

363.0 intersect line 1-2 Sur No 3217 McCann lode at S 87° 36' E 0.84 ft from Cor No 1; at this point is also established a witness corner for Cor No 3, being a pine post 4 ft long 4 ins sq set 18 ins in the ground in a mound of stones and scribed WC-3-3218 E,

370.1 to north edge of 300 ft stope,

380.1 to exact location for, N E Cor, identical with location and with the location for Cors No 1 and 4 of Sur No 367 Am Wedge lode and Lot No. 40 Lucky Cuss lode, respectively, (This corner falls in a stope that runs from the surface to a depth of 300 ft. For this reason it was impossible to establish a corner.) W.C. heretofore described brs. N. 3° 07' E 17.1 ft. W.C. hereafter described brs. N 69° 12' W. 16.9 ft. This corner point is on line 4-1 McCann lode, Sur. No. 3217, S. 0° 18' W. 17.10 ft. from Cor. No. 1. thence N 69° 12' W

11.9 to west edge of open stope,

16.9 to witness corner for Cor No 3, being a pine post 4 ft long 4 ins sq set 18 ins in the ground in a mound of stones and scribed WC-3-3218 E,

a pine post 4 ft long 4 ins sq set 18 ins in the ground in a mound of stones and scribed 4-3218 E,

whence a limestone ledge with 60 x 41 ins exposure and chiseled BR x 4-3218 brs S 20° 35' W 25.2 ft., and a second limestone ledge 93 x 54 ins exposure with like chiseling brs S 41° 23' E 36.1 ft.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a C. L. Berger & Sons No 1 C transit. The course were deflected from the true meridian as determined by a Solar observation. The distances were measured with a 300 foot steel tape. Magnetic variation $12^{\circ} 15'$ East at all corners.

REPORT.

Cor to Secs 10, 11, 14 and 15, Tp 20S., R22 E., is a lime-stone rock $4 \times 10 \times 9$ ins high, chiseled II on east face, and IIII on south face. A monument of stones 3 ft west.

Lot No 40, Gen No 137 Lucky Cuss lode.

Cor No 4 is missing, but its position was determined by its identity with Cor. No. 1

Cor No 1 is a monument of rocks, post gone. Wedge lode, Sur. No. 1367 Am.

I find line 1-4 to be $N 0^{\circ} 18' E 1492.0$ ft., instead of $N 2^{\circ} E 1499.8$ ft.

Survey No 259 Owls Nest.

Cor No 5, is a pine post 4×4 ins sq scribed ONNo5.

Cor No 6, is a pine post 4×4 ins sq scribed ONNo6.

I find line 5-6 to be $S 33^{\circ} 53' W 1357.0$ ft instead of $S 34^{\circ} 50' W 1354.5$ ft.

Sur No 367 Am. Wedge lode.

Cor No 7 was a monument of rocks, post missing.

Cor No 1 is missing.

I find line 7-1 to be $S 69^{\circ} 12' E 219.6$ ft instead of $S 67^{\circ} 30' E 220.0$ ft.

The position of Cor No 1 was determined from distance given for line 1-2 Sur No 367 Am Wedge lode in Survey Nos 367 and 265.

AMENDED NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION
LODE CLAIM

JUL 12 1915

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This mining claim, the name of which is the "ESCONDIDO" Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there is a vein or lode of mineral bearing rock in place carrying gold, silver, copper and other valuable deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by the Bunker Hill Mines Company, a corporation, and citizen of the United States, the undersigned, on the 18 day of June 1915.

The length of this claim is 400 feet and we claim 150 feet of the lode in a Southerly direction and 250 feet of the lode in a Northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 120 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the claim and the lode therein is from the South to the North.

The claim is situated and located in the Tombstone Mining District, in Cochise County, in the State of Arizona, and the discovery shaft thereof is about 5500 feet in a Southwesterly direction from the Court House, Tombstone, Arizona, in the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 14, Township 20 South, Range 22 East, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, and is bounded on the East by Lot No. 40, "Lucky Cus," on the South by Survey No. 367, "Wedge," on the West by Survey No. 259, "Owls Nest."

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows:

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Beginning at a monument of stones and a post in a Southerly direction 150 feet from the discovery shaft, (at which this notice is posted), being in the center of the South end line of said claim; thence Northwesterly 120 feet to a monument of stones and a post, being the Southwest corner of said claim; thence Northeasterly 400 feet to a monument of stones and a post, being at the Northwest corner of said claim; thence Southeasterly 10 feet to a monument of stones and a post, being the center of the North end line of said claim; thence Southeasterly 10 feet to a monument of stones and a post, being at the Northeast corner of said claim; thence Southerly 400 feet to a monument of stones and a post, being the Southeast corner of said claim; thence Northwesterly 120 feet to the place of beginning.
