This survey was made with a Gurley Solar Transit. The courses were deflected from the meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run direct upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines.

All tie lines were run direct on the ground.

From the common improvement shaft No. 2 Big Two lode the surface rises for about 200 ft. to the south then descends toward the south, and descends slightly for a bout 300 ft. northerly then ascends slightly to 600 ft. northerly from south end of Big 4 lode. This shaft is so situated that all the claims in the group may be developed by drifting and crosscutting.

I have searched diligently for corners of the public land survey in T. 15 N., R. 3 W. and vicinity, without finding any.
