INSTRUMENT AND DETERMINATION OF MERIDIAN.

This survey was made with a Bergers Engineers transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

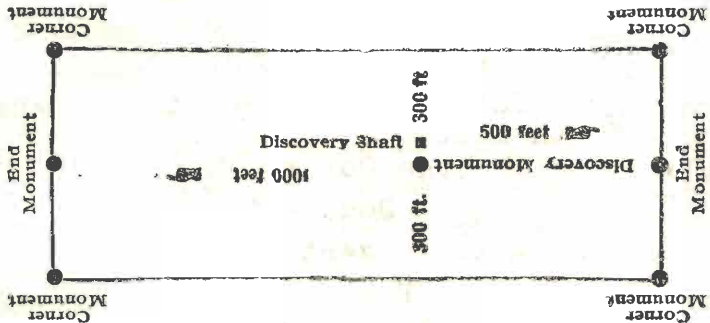

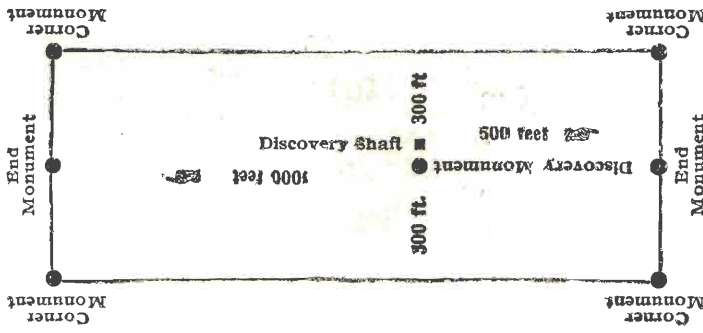
