INSTRUMENT.

The instrument used in making this survey was, a Wm. Ainsworth and Son's mining transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with 50 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lode line of each location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode lines. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground or by traverses upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.
