Cor. to Secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, T. 7 N., R. 17 W., G. & S. R. M., is a stone 6 x 8 ins. showing 6 ins. above ground having 5 notches chiseled on its south edge and 5 notches on its east edge.

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I find the south one half of line between Secs. 5 and 6, T. 7 N., R. 17 W., G. S. R. M., to be N. 0° 04' W. 2645 ft. and the west one half of line between Secs. 5 and 8 to be N. 89° 59' W. 2644.8 ft.

Some of the "Other Improvements" hereinbefore described are said to have been made prior to the location of this claim and some of them are said to be claimed by A. J. Eddy.

The claimant has stated its intention to extend improvement No. 2 to the point of discovery at such time as may be deemed convenient.

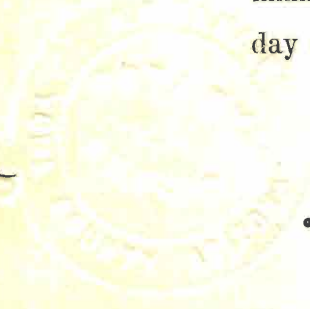

NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.
