TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Umpire Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Chas. W. Rambo, Louis Brown and W.E. Hankins, ----- the undersigned, on the 3 day of March, 1903.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred (1500) feet and we claim 1000 feet, in a Southerly direction, and 500 feet in a Northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South.

The claim is situated and located in the Warren Mining District, in Cochise County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 1 1/2 miles in a Westerly direction from Bisbee P. O. and joins the Santa Rosa and Portland mineral claims on the East, and the City of Paris on the South, the Spokane No. 5 mineral claim on the West.
