REPORT

The lode line was run direct upon the ground and the corners were established by means of offsets from the lode line. The tie lines were run direct upon the ground. The cor. of secs. 25 and 36 T.23 N. R.13 W. is a sandstone 10x8x9 ins. above ground with mound of stone and properly marked.

The cor. of secs. 30 and 31 T. 23 N. R.12 W. is an iron pipe with mound of stone and properly marked.

Cors. No. 1 of Silver Bell and No. 5 of Yellow Girl lodes, survey No. 3011 is a malpais stone 6x6x12 ins. with mound of stone, chiseled SB1-Y5-3011.

The S.W. and S.E. cors. of the Walkover lode uns. are mounds of stone 3x3 ft.

The S.E. cor. of the Dixie Queen lode is a mound of stone 2x2½ ft. The N.E. and S.W. cors. are mounds of stone 3x3 ft.

INSTRUMENT
