Purdy, Emil Marks, Isaac Jacobson, Sam Frankenberg, Citizens of the United States, the undersigned, on the 9th day of July 1917.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and we claim 400 feet, in a southerly direction and 1100 feet in a northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north to the south.
