TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the **Silver Lead** Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by C. W. Rambo and I. Jacobson, citizens of the United States, the undersigned, on the 1st day of October, 1917.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and we claim 300 feet, in a northerly direction and 1200 feet in a southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north to the south.

The claim is situated and located in the Warren Mining District, in Cochise County, in the State of Arizona, about 2 miles in a northwesterly direction from Bisbee P.O. and the adjoining claims are: on the north, Blue Bird; on the east, the Winnebago; on the west, Knickerbocker.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the grounds as follows: Beginning at a monument of stones at a point in a northerly direction 300 feet from the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted), being in the center of the north end line of said claim; thence northeasterly 300 feet to a post being the northeast corner of said claim; thence southerly 1500 feet to a post, being at the southeast corner of said claim; thence southwesterly 300 feet to a monument of stones at the center of the south end of said claim; thence southwesterly 300 feet to a post, being at the southwest corner of said claim; thence northerly 1500 feet to a post at the northwest corner of said claim; thence northeasterly 300 feet to the place of beginning.


