The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and we claim 200 feet in a westerly direction and 1300 feet in an easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lenth-wise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Wrst to the East.
