THIS MINING CLAIM, the same of which is the YAQUI SCOUT Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by C.W.Rambo, Citizen, the undersigned, on the First day of April, 1917,

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 100 feet in a Southerly direction and 1400 feet in a Northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the South to the North.

The claim is situated and located in the Warren Mining District in Cochise County, in the State of Arizona, about 1500 feet in a Southerly direction from the Cowan Spring and joins the Pilgrim Lode claim on the East.
