Total area Oversight Copper lode, 20.293 acres.

Location.

This survey is located on unsurveyed land, in what will probably be, when surveyed, sections 15 and 16, T. 1 N., R. 14 E., G. & S.R.B. & M., Globe Mining District, Gila County, Arizona, in the Crook National Forest.

Expenditure of Five Hundred Dollars.

I certify that the value of the labor and improvements made on this claim by the claimant, or her grantors, is not less than five hundred dollars, and that said improvements consist of:

No. 1, the discovery, 30 ft. of cut, 5 x 10 ft., which is intersected by the lode line 163.0 ft. from the N.W. E.C. and which extends thence N.62°E. 9.5 ft to toe of cut and S.62°W. 5.5 ft. to pt. 1; thence N.36°W. 8.0 ft. to face. And, from pt. 1, S.36°E. 7.0 ft. to face.

Value, \$225.00.

No. 2, an irregular shaped pit, averaging 8.5 x 12 x 4 ft., the S.E. corner of which ^{bears} N.83°-10'E. 328.5 ft. from Cor. No. 2. Value, \$125.00

No. 3, cut, 4 x 10 x 15 ft., course S.42°W., the center of the toe of which bears N.83°-59'E. 320.0 ft. from Cor. No. 2. Value, \$50.00.

No. 4, 30 ft. of cut and tunnel, 4.5 x 6.5 ft., the center of the portal of which bears S.82°-58'E. 377.2 ft. from Cor. No.2, and which extends thence S.70°E. 15.0 ft. to toe of cut and N.31°W. 19.0 ft. to face of tunnel. Value, \$200.00.

Other Improvements.

A shaft, 4 x 6 x 35 ft., the S.E. corner of which bears N.88°-35'E. 329.5 ft. from Cor. No. 2. The value of this shaft is not credited to the claim on account of not having been made by the claimant or her grantors.

Instrument and Determination of Meridian.

This survey was made with a 6¼ inch Berger transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observation. The distances were measured with a 660 ft. steel tape.

Adjoining and Conflicting Claims.

This claim is surrounded on the northeast, southeast, and southwest by unappropriated land. On the north is the Empress/^{Copper}lode, Sur. 3558, ~~unapproved~~, owned by The Globe & Lost Gulch Silver Copper Mines Company.

Report.

The side and end lines of this claim and all tie lines were run direct ^upon the ground.

U.S.L.M. No. 2652, to which tie is given from Cor. No.1, is a pine post, 6 x 8 ins., showing 6 ft. out of the ground, surrounded by a mound of stone, 6 ft. base and

3 ft. high, scribed U.S.L.M. 2652.

Cor. 1 and 4 of the Empress Copper lode, Sur. 3558. ~~unapproved~~, are 3/4 inch drill holes in dacite in place, about which are chiseled the proper markings for the corners, with monuments of stone alongside. I find the tie line from Cor. No. 1 of this claim to U.S.L.M. No. 2652 correct as reported in my returns of Sur. 3558.

The disagreement between these notes and the location notice is due to error in the notice.
