REPORT.

The 1/4 Cor. between Secs. 19 and 30, T. 23 S., R. 24 E., is a porphyry rock 7 x 9 x 9 inches high, chiseled 1/4 on the north face.

1/4 Cor. between Secs. 7 and 18, T. 23 S., R. 24 E., is an iron pipe with copper cap, properly marked. This corner is unapproved.


