INSTRUMENT

This Survey was made with a C. L. Berger and Sons No. 2 Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

REPORT

All lines and ties in this survey were run upon the ground and the courses and distances found to be as herein given.

No bearing objects were available in the survey.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ Cors between Sec's 3 and 34, ^{34 & 35, 2 & 35, and 2 & 3,} T.s 18 & 19 N. R. 20 W., G. & S. R. M., are ^{each} a 1 in. iron pipe with a brass cap, properly set and marked.

The Cor. to Sec's 2-3-34 & 35 T.s 18 & 19 N. R. 20 W. G. & S. R. M. is a 2 in. iron pipe with brass cap, properly set and marked.

Sur. No. 3565 Camp Site, Jumbo, Red Bird, Lazy Boy, Combination and Combination Fraction lodes, all corners are redwood posts properly set and scribed.
