The N. W. Cor. of Sec. 30, T. 23 S., R. 24 E., is a limestone rock in place 5½ x 11 x 5 inches above ground, and chiseled II on south face, and IIII on north face. The Cor. of Secs. 13 and 24, T. 23 S., R. 23 E., and 18 and 19, T. 23 S., R. 24 E., is an iron pipe with copper cap.


