Lode Line.

As near as can be determined from present development, the vein of this location extends N.77°-21'W. 985.7 ft., and S.77°-21'E. 484.3 ft. from the discovery shaft.

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Location.

This survey is located approximately in ^{Sec 36} T.41S., R.16 E., G. & S.R.B. & M., unsurveyed, Globe Mining District, Gila County, Arizona, in the San Carlos Indian Reservation.

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Adjoining and Conflicting Claims.

Vacant land on the north. The G.String No. 1 and G. String No. 2 lodes, unsurveyed, owned by R.M. Anderson et al., adjoin and conflict on the east. The Sun Down and SunSet lodes, unsurveyed, owned by Zee Hayes et al.; and the G. String No. 3 lode, unsurveyed, owned by R.M. Anderson et al., adjoin on the south. The G.String No. 4 lode, unsurveyed, owned by R.M. Anderson et al., adjoins and conflicts on the west.

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Discovery and Improvements.

I certify that the improvements made upon this claim by the claimants and the values thereof are as follows:

No 1, the discovery, shaft, 4 x 6 x 8 ft., the center of which is on the lode line 484.3 ft. from the East End Center. Value \$40.00.

No. 2 cut, 5 x 10 x 18 ft., the center of the face of which bears N.76°-10'E. 114.0 ft. from a point on the lode line 557.2 ft. from the East End Center. Value \$40.00.

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Improvements Not Made By Claimants.

A shaft, 4 x 6 x 8 ft., the center of which bears N.74°-14'E. 60.9 ft. from a point on the lode line 557.2 ft. from the East End Center.

A shaft, 4.5 x 6 x 9 ft., the center of which bears N.87°-00'E. 116.3 ft. from the above described point.

Area.

Total Area Outlaw Lode 20.244 acres.

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Instrument and Determination of Meridian.

This survey was made with a 6 1/4 inch Berger Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observations. The distances were measured with a 660 foot steel tape.

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Report.

The side and end lines of this claim were run direct upon the ground. The tie to U.S.L.M. No. 3656 was computed through a tie run from a point on line 4-1 of the claim, 51.9 ft. from Cor. No. 4, N.16°-58'-30"E. 330.0 ft. to the monument. U.S.L.M. No. 3656 is a granite stone 10 x 20 x 31 ins., set 16 ins. in the ground, with mound of stone alongside, and chiseled cross U.S.D.M. 3656.

The disagreement between these notes and the location notice is due to errors in the notice.

REPORT OF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF U.S.L.M. NO.3656.

In the execution of Mineral Survey No. 3656 I find that the claim is not within the two mile limit of an approved corner of the public survey or a U.S.L.M., so I established U.S.L.M. No.3656.

On a hill which is visible for a great distance in all directions I selected a point and set a granite stone, 10 x 20 x 31 ins., 16 ins. in the ground and chiseled a cross for the exact point and U.S.L.M. 3656 thereon, and took the following bearings:

A cross on granite in place, about which is chiseled
U.S.L.M.
B.R./3656, bears N.87°-04'W. 31.25 ft.

A granite boulder showing 1 x 1.5 x 3 ft. out of the ground, chiseled cross B.R.-U.S.L.M. 3656, bears N.65°-43'E. 6.90 ft.

A monument of stone, 6 ft. base and 6 ft. high, bears S.56°-00'E. 13.0 ft.

The railroad water tank at Cutter, a station on the Arizona Eastern Railway, bears N.07°-41'E. about four miles.

As near as can be determined by observation with the instrument used, this monument is in Latitude 33°-18'-45" North. And the Longitude is approximately 110°-41' West.




