The survey of the lode is within the Boundaries of the location as staked on the ground, Cor. No. 1, being identical.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley light mountain transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by solar observations. The distances were measured with a 500.ft. steel tape.
