IMPROVEMENTS.

I certify, that the labor and improvements made upon or for the benefit of the location embraced in said mining claim, by the claimants or their grantors, is as follows:

No.1- The discovery cut, Sunnyside, the face of which being the discovery point, is on the lode line 780 ft. from the center of line 1-2, 5 ft. wide, 6 ft. face, running S.10° 00'W. 20 ft. to mouth.

OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

Instrument.

The instrument used in making this survey was a Buff & Buff Mining Transit.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with a five hundred foot steel tape.

REPORT.

The lode line of the location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

U.S.M.M.No.3 is a white sandstone 6 ins.by 20 ins.square, projecting 1 foot above the ground, with a X on top and chiseled U.S.M.M.No.3, SUNNYSIDE, on the east side.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.

Note;- The slight discrepancy between these notes and the amended location certificate with reference to the tie to U.S.M.M.No.3, is due to an error in said certificate.

The discovery cut shows a vein or ore in place.

U.S.M.M.No.3 is a white sandstone 32 ins.long,6 ins.by 20 ins.square set 20 ins.in the ground. Monument is set on prominent ridge higher than the surrounding country. Monument is chiseled X on top and U.S. M.M.No.3,SUNNYSIDE,on the east side.
