INSTRUMENT.

The instrument used in making this survey was a C.L. Berger & Sons Mining Transit.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.

The distances were measured with a five hundred foot steel tape.

REPORT.

The lode lines of each of the locations embraced in this claim were run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

U.S.M.M. No. 1 is a sandstone, 9 ins. by 20 ins. square, projecting 1 foot above the ground, chiseled with a X on top and U.S.M.M. No. 1-PRESTON, on the east side.

Diligent search and extensive inquiry was made for corners of the Public Survey within a radius of several miles of said claim, but there are apparently none to be found. As these corners are purported to have been established some fifty years ago, it is very probable that if any remain standing they have been buried by the shifting sands of this region.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.
