The corners of this survey are stones properly set and chiseled with the number of the corner and survey.

The discrepancies found existing between the claim as marked by the location monuments and as described in the location notices are due to errors in the location notices.

I hereby certify that the value of the labor performed and improvements made upon or for the benefit of the lode embraced in Mineral Survey No. 3745, by the claimant or its grantors is not less than \$500.00 and that said improvement in addition to that which was reported at the time of making the survey, consists of :-

An undivided 1/89 th. interest in improvement No. 1, TWO lode Mineral Sur. No. 3436, hereinafter described.

COMMON IMPROVEMENT

Improvement No. 1 Two lode Sur. No. 3436 is the portal end of a tunnel, now constructed, the terminal point of which is at the AUDREY Shaft, on the Iron Carbonate lode Sur. No. 1212, property of the claimant. This improvement commencing at the lowest possible point for a tunnel-site, was driven to develop the lodes of the several groups owned by the claimant. The portal of the tunnel is accessible by railroad, and permits more economical handling of mining operations, in the development of the several groups through which it passes. It will give a maximum depth of about 1600 feet, in the development of the higher lodes of the claimant, and proportionately lower as we get closer to the portal. In its length of 12395 feet it will develop a district geologically for a great distance on either side, thus enabling further lateral development, in view of the fact that it is a "cross-cut" tunnel. As this tunnel traverses an area to the east of the great North and South fault of the Verde District, it develops the area geologically due to the fact that surface conditions, do not permit of close study of the geological structures and accordingly is a very great asset in the mining operation.

This tunnel will be used as a haulage tunnel for ore developed

developed by shafts due to enormous flows of water encountered. making into consideration geological conditions, haulage advantages, and drainage possibilities, I consider this improvement a common improvement and of such a character as to redound to the benefit of the following groups and lodes therein mentioned to wit;-

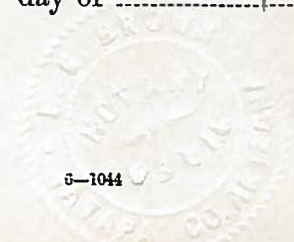
