This survey was made with a Buff & Buff transit. The courses ~~was~~ <sup>ere</sup> deflected from a true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris near its eastern elongation using tables furnished by A. Lietz Co. for making observation on Polaris at any hour. The distances ~~were~~ measured with a 100 and 300 ft. steel tape.

ADJOINING CLAIMS:

The CC of Secs. 5 & 8, <sup>Frac.</sup> T.1N., R.16E., G. & S.R. B. & M. on West Boundary of the White Mt. Indian Reservation is a white limestone stone, 8 x .8<sub>4</sub> square, projecting .5 ft. out of ground, chiseled WMIR WB on west side and CCS 5 on north side and S8 on south side. This is the nearest Cor. of the public survey.

The 59 $\frac{1}{2}$  M Cor. WMIR-WB is a yellow limestone stone, 1.3 x .6 ft. rectangular, projecting .5<sup>ft.</sup> out of ground, chiseled WMIR-WB-59 $\frac{1}{2}$ M on east side.

The 59M Cor WMIR-WB is a limestone stone, .6 x 1.0 ft. square, projecting .6 ft. above ground, chiseled WMIR-WB-59M.

The 60 M Cor WMIR-WB is a red colored igneous iron stained wedge shaped stone, 18 in. long, 12 ins. wide, 8 ins. thick lying flat on ground, chiseled WMIR-WB-60M.


