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LOCATION.

This survey is located on unsurveyed land in what will probably be, when surveyed, section 36, T. 1 N., R. 13 E., G. & S.R.M., Globe Mining District, Gila County, Arizona, in the Crook National Forest.

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ADJOINING AND CONFLICTING CLAIMS.

The Crown Point No. 1 lode, of Sur. 2840, owned by

the Crown Point Copper Company; and the Red Wing lode, of Sur. 2676, owned by the claimant, conflict and adjoin on the northeast. The White Horse and Hobo lodes, of Sur. 2676, owned by the claimant; and the Dictator lode, uns., owned by Carl Eder, adjoin on the southeast. The Sun Rise lode, unsurveyed, owned by Carl Eder, conflicts on the southwest. And, the Pinto lode, Sur. 2690, owned by the claimant; and the Rambler lode, unsurveyed, owned by Carl Eder, conflict and adjoin on the northwest.

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DISCOVERY AND IMPROVEMENTS.

I certify that the value of the labor and improvements made upon this claim, by the claimant or its grantors, are of the value set forth herein, and that said improvements consist of:

No. 1, the discovery, shaft. 5 x 7 x 8 ft., the center of which is on the lode line 847.5 ft. from the S.W.E.C. Value, \$45.00.

No. 2, 33.5 ft. of cut and tunnel, 3.5 x 6 ft., the center of the toe of which bears S.60°-38'W. 201.0 ft. from a point on line 4-1, 139.4 ft. from Cor. No. 4, and which extends thence S.58°W. to face. Value, \$200.00.

No. 3, ^{shaft,} 5 x 5 x 15 ft., timbered, the N.E. Cor. of which bears S.64°-43'W. 191.0 ft. from the above described point. Value, \$175.00.

Prior to the expiration of the period of publication of the claimant's notice of application for patent, report will be made of additional work to be performed in order to bring the total value of improvements up to \$500.00.

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OTHER IMPROVEMENTS.

A shaft, 5 x 7 x 8 ft., the S.E. Cor. of which bears N.52°-17'W. 239.2 ft. from a point on line 4-1, 638.0 ft. from Cor. No. 4. This shaft is not credited to the claim on account of having been made prior to its location.

INSTRUMENT AND DETERMINATION OF MERIDIAN.

This survey was made with a $6\frac{1}{4}$ inch Berger transit. The distances were measured with a 660 foot steel tape, and the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observations.

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REPORT.

The standard quarter corner of section 36, T. 1 N., R. 13 E., G. & S.R.M., to which tie is given from Cor. No. 1, is a set schist stone, showing 4 x 9 x 7 ins. out of the ground, chiseled cross at the exact corner and SC $\frac{1}{4}$ on the north face, with mound of stone alongside. The tie to this corner was computed from a traverse run from Cor. No. 1 S. $03^{\circ}-05'W$. 1492.4 ft.; thence S. $34^{\circ}-11'E$. 183.5 ft.; thence S. $09^{\circ}-32'E$. 254.1 ft.; thence S. $05^{\circ}-30'E$. 294.5 ft. to the quarter corner.

Sur. 2676, Red Wing, White Horse and Hobo lodes:

Cor. No. 1 of the Red Wing lode, Cor. No. 2 of the White Horse lode and Cors. Nos. 2 and 3 of the Hobo lode are all 4 x 4 posts, properly set and scribed. I find Cor. No. 2 of the Red Wing lode and Cor. No. 3 of the White Horse lode rotted off flush with the ground and I accepted the center of the remaining part of the posts for the corner points. The disagreement between these notes and line 1-2 of the Red Wing lode, line 2-3 of the White Horse lode and line 2-3 of the Hobo lode, as approved, and these lines as reported herein, is due to errors in Sur. 2676.

Sur. 2840, Crown Point No. 1 lode:

Cors. 1 and 2 of this claim are 4 x 4 posts, properly set and scribed. There is a nominal disagreement between the bearing of line 1-2 of this claim as approved, and as reported herein. The disagreement between the bearing of line 1-2 of the Red Wing lode, Sur. 2676, as reported herein, and this line as reported in the returns of Sur. 2840, is due to error in Sur. 2840.

Sur. 2690, Pinto lode:

All of the corners of this claim are 4 x 4 posts, properly set and scribed. The disagreement between these notes and lines 1-2 and 4-1 is due to errors in Sur. 2690. I find the bearing of line 3-4 correct as approved.

Sun Rise lode, unsurveyed.

The N.E. and N.W. corners of this claim are monuments of stone.

Sur. 3837, Mayflower lode and Sur. 2525, Lucky Charlie lode:

Cor. No. 2 of said Mayflower lode, which is identical with Cor. No. 2 of the Lucky Charlie lode, is a cedar tree, properly scribed.

The disagreement between these notes and the location notice is due to errors in the notice.


