This survey is located on unsurveyed ground which when surveyed will be approximately Sec. 20 T.6N. R. 17E. G.&S.R. B.& M. within the boundary of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation about 1¼ miles in a northwesterly direction from the junction of Cibique Creek and Salt River

INSTRUMENT:

This survey was made with a Gurley transit

Min. Sur. No. 3929 continued

The course was deflected from a true meridian as determined by an observation on Polaris at its eastern elongation. The distance was measured with a 500 ft. steel tape.

ADJOINING CLAIMS:

Min. Sur. NO. 3929 is bounded on all sides by unappropriated ground.

ESTABLISHMENT OF U.S.L.M. NO. 3929.

U.S.L.M. No. 3929 has a Latitude of $33^{\circ}51'$ and is a rectangular quartzite outcrop 29 x 13 by 20 ft. high with the letters USLM No. 3929 and X for exact point chiseled 2.8 ft. from the northwest edge and 11 ft. from the northwest corner with a conical mound of stone 6 ft. base and 5 ft. high alongside. A flat quartzite outcrop 4 x 2 x 1.4 ft. chiseled BR-USLM No. 3929 with a X for the exact point bears $N.21^{\circ}02'W.$ 29.65 ft.. A flat quartzite outcrop 6 x 2 x 2 ft. square chiseled BR-USLM No. 3929 bears $N.39^{\circ}24'E.$ 17.57 ft. The junction of Cibique Creek and Salt River bears $S.17^{\circ}03'E.$ approximately $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles. The Riegel Asbestos Camp bears $S.33^{\circ}37'W.$ approximately 4 miles. The high rock peak opposite the Needle's Eye bears $S.25^{\circ}33'E.$ approximately $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles.


