A corrugated iron garage, the SW corner of which bears from Corner No.3, S.63°15'E., 87 feet, 30x60 feet; course of long sides N.9°E.

A house, the NW corner of which bears from a point on line 3-4, 211 feet from Corner No.3, S.51°39'E., 36 feet; course of long sides S.81°E.

REPORT:

The lode line of this location was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offset from the lode line. The tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Sections 23 and 24, T.12 S., R.6 W., G. & S.R.M., is a 1-inch iron pipe, brass-capped, properly set and marked.

Corners 1 and 2, C. & A. No. 2 lode, are 1-inch iron pipes, brass-capped, properly set and marked.

Survey 3488, Quartzite lode;

All corners are 4-inch iron pipes, showing 50 inches above the ground, copper-capped, properly set and stamped with the number of the corner and survey. The discrepancy between this survey and survey 3488 as to the length of line 2-3 Quartzite lode is due to error in the latter.

I find the course of line 2-3, and the course and distance of line 3-4 correct as approved.

This survey is bounded on the north by the Howard No. 2 lode, unsurveyed, Sam Clark et al claimant; on the east by Ford No. 1 lode, unsurveyed, belonging to claimant herein; on the south by the Quartzite lode, Survey 3488, New Cornelia Copper Co., claimant; on the west by the C. & A. 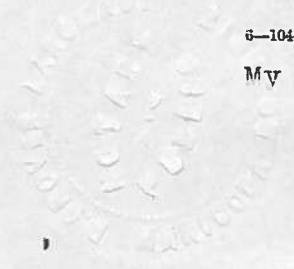


