The N $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 4, T. 2 S. R. 3 E. is not in place, evidently having been destroyed, as the adjacent monument of stone is considerably scattered around; I therefore tied this survey to the S $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 33 T. 1 S. R. 3 E. a stone properly set and marked.
