INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Gurley Transit, the courses were deflected from the meridian from direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a five-hundred and fifty foot steel tape.

REPORT:

The lode line of this claim was run upon the ground, and the several corners were established by offsets therefrom. The tie line was run direct upon the ground. Cor. to Secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, T9N, R2W, and $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. between Secs. 33 and 34, T9N, R2W are pipes properly marked. Cor. No. 2, Sur. No. 1200, Mammoth Lode, is a porphyry stone 8 X 10 X 12" above ground, properly marked. I could not find Cors. No. 3 and 4, Sur. No. 1200 Mammoth Lode, hence accepted the record of lines 2-3 and 3-4.
