INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Gurley mountain transit, the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 500.0 ft. steel tape.

REPORT.

The lode line of the location of this claim was run directly upon the ground, the corners were established by running around the claim.

The Cor. to Secs. 17,18, 19 and 20, T. 10 S. R. 16 E., consists of a porphyry rock 10 x 12 ins. above ground, chiseled with 5 notches on the east and 3 notches on the south.

U.S. M.M. No.4 consists of a pine post 6 ins. sq. by 8 ft. high, surrounded with md of stone 6 ft. base by 4 ft. high, scribed U.S.M.M. No. IV.

Sur. No.687 Southern Belle lode. All corners consist of pine posts properly set and scribed with the number of the Corners with the initials "S B " Lines 2-3 and 3-5 fail to furnish the courses and distances as approved and same are properly given in these field notes.

Sur. No.2108 A. Lewis lode. All corners consist of redwood posts properly set and scribed with the number of the corners and the survey. Line 4-1 fails to furnish the course and distance as approved, and same is properly given in these field notes.

Sur. No.1838 Humming Bird lode. All corners consist of redwood posts, properly set and scribed with the number of the corners and the survey. All lines fail to furnish the courses as approved, and the tie from Cor. No.1, Sur. No.2108 Lewis lode fails to furnish the course and distance as approved and same are properly given in these field notes .
