Mineral survey No: 4204 was made with a Gurley Mountain transit with horizontal limb 6.5 ins. diam. having two opposite verniers and full vertical circle, 5 ins: diam. having one double vernier. The verniers read to one minute of arc.

The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey; all adjustments were in good order.
