Mineral Survey No. 4299 was made with a W. & L.E. Gurley light mountain transit, with horizontal limb 5.50 ins. diam., having two double opposite verniers, and full vertical circle 4.50 ins. diam., having one double vernier; the verniers read to one minute of arc; the eyepiece is equipped with a colored glass shutter prismatic attachment for making direct observations upon the sun. The instrument was in good condition at the time of the survey and all adjustments were in good order. An a.m. altitude observation of the sun for azimuth was made on line 2-3 of this survey, the details of which are shown in the calculation sheet herewith submitted for examination. All azimuths in this record are referred to the reference line thus determined, by the method of deflection angles and calculated courses.

The lines were measured with a Keuffel & Esser steel tape 300 feet in length, graduated every foot with the end feet to hundredths, which was compared for standard length at the time of the survey, and found correct.

All lines and connections of this survey were run by direct methods.

The magnetic variation observed at each corner of the survey gave a uniform value of $14^{\circ}28'E$.



Descriptive Report on Malibu Placer, Mineral Survey No.
4299

- 'A' The quality and composition of the soil on this claim is of silt, sand and gravel to a depth of 50 ft. or more over the larger portion. Outcropping rock in place is exposed in the approximate southeast quarter of the claim. The timber and vegetation on the claim are typical desert variety, consisting of cactus, palo verde, mesquite, cat-claw and greasewood, with some planted cottonwood and tamarisk trees for shade purposes.
- 'B' There are no live streams on the claim. The typical dry washes which traverse the premises may run some water during heavy rainfall periods only and all flow into the Hassayampa River which flows Southerly about one eighth mile west of the west line of the claim.
- 'C' The mining work done on this claim consists of open cuts of various lengths and depths as set forth in the accompanying field notes and plat of survey.
- 'D' The nearest trade center of size is the town of Wickenburg, Arizona, located about 5 miles northerly on the main highway which runs along the west line of the claim. The claimant has a combination store and living quarters on the property as well as several cabins for residential purposes.
- 'E' There are no known lode systems or deposits on or near the claim.
- 'F' This claim is well adapted to a small scale placer operation as there is an abundance of sand and gravel carrying medium values in gold, and an ample supply of water is available by pumping from the two wells of shallow depth which the claimant has developed on the property. All of the area lying along the east side of the Hassayampa River for a distance of several miles both north and south has been placer mined for gold values during the past 50 to 60 years.

'G' The mining work done on this claim by the claimant or his grantors for the development of the claim consists of open cuts along with the two wells for which an ample amount of money has been expended as set forth in the accompanying field notes of this survey.

'H' There are no known mines, salt licks, salt springs or mill sites located on or near this claim.
