The mesa land can be rated as 2<sup>nd</sup> class and the mountains as 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> class.

There are a few cottonwood trees along Tonto Creek.

Tonto Creek has abundant water the greater part of the year for the irrigation of the bottom lands.

Over the entire township is a growth of cat-claw bush well named, as ever bush

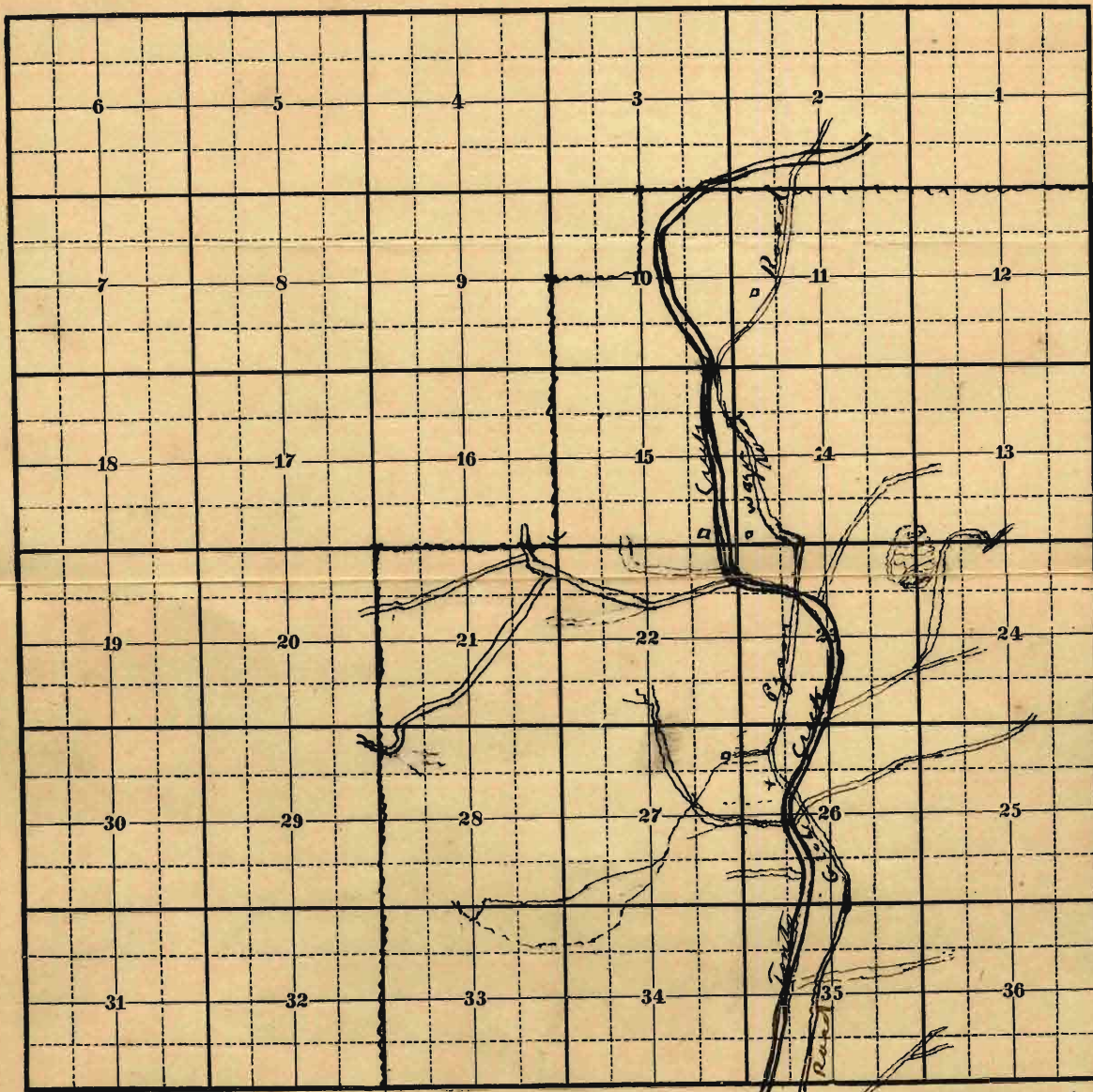
