General Description.

This Sp contains nearly every variety of land from plain to mountain and the soil ranges from sandy loam to rocky and worthless. The Sp generally is covered with a good growth of nutritious grasses and dense mes-

quite underground. The western portion of the Sp is level and gently rolling while the <sup>eastern</sup> part is mountainous. There is no timber within this Sp. Water is only found in wells dug by settlers. Owing to the rapid growth of the town of Douglas, which is situated in Secs 13 and 24 Sp. 24 S. R. 27 E. quite a number of settlers are taking up land in the Sp. The El Paso and Southern railroad runs through secs 5, 6 and 7.

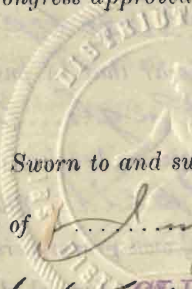
