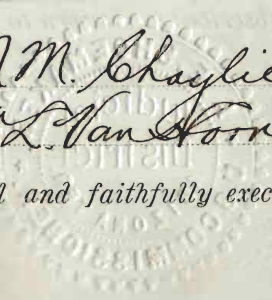

This instrument was examined &  
compared by me with the  
true Meridian at Tucson, Arizona  
on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July and  
found to be in perfect adjustment.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April, 1883,  
I set my instrument at the  
cor. to Tps. 7<sup>and</sup> 8 N., Rs. 28<sup>and</sup> 29 E.,  
carefully examined it in  
all its adjustments, particularly  
the latitude and leveling  
apparatus and found them  
correct. I took the latitude  
and found it to be  $34^{\circ}00' N$ ,  
and proceed to survey as
