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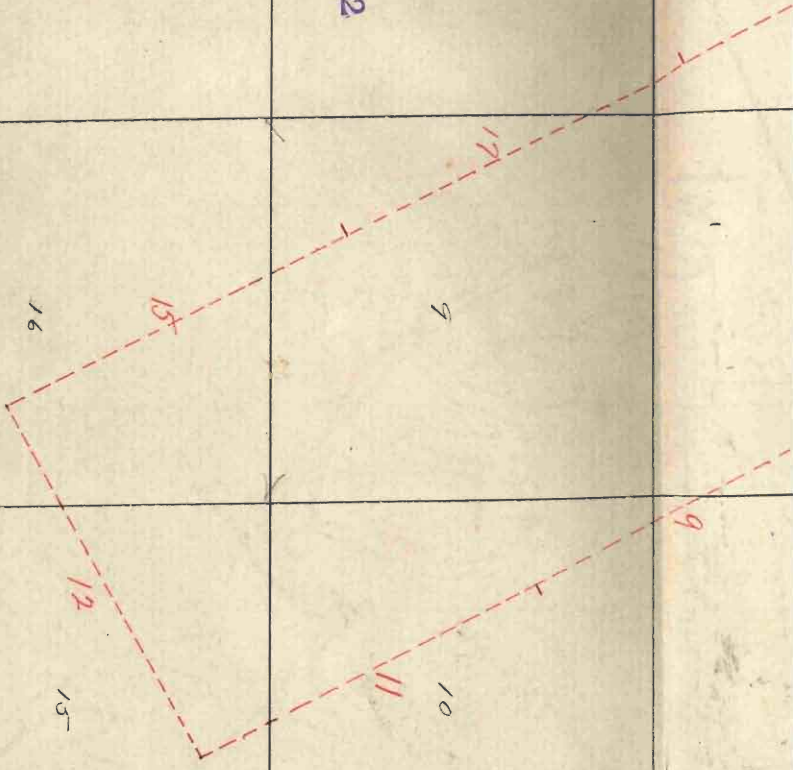
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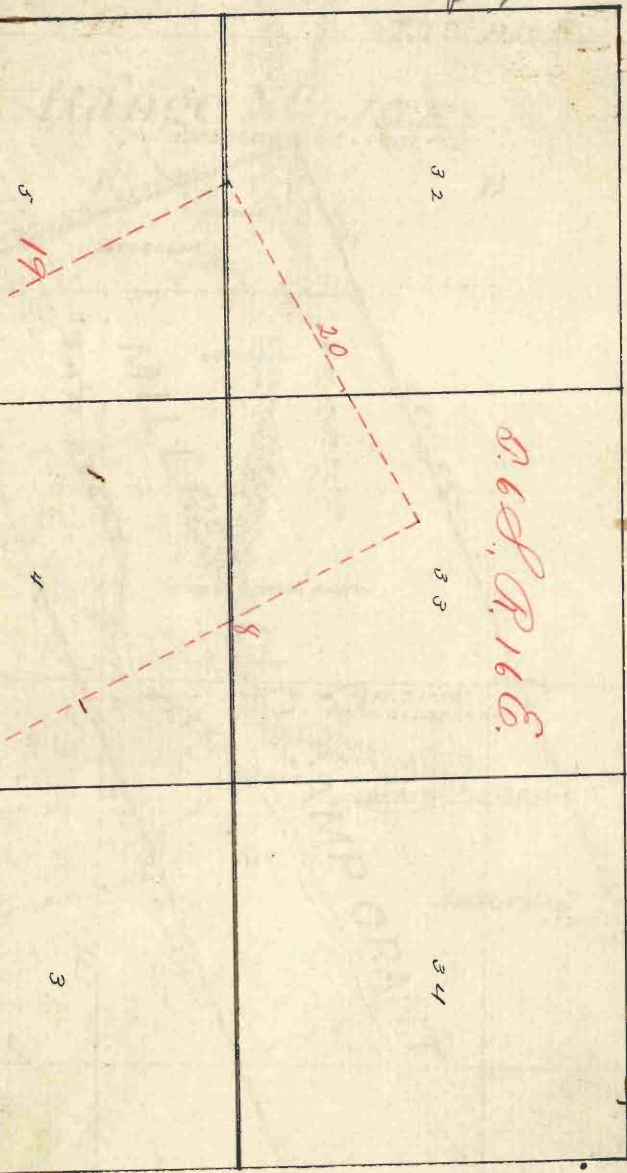

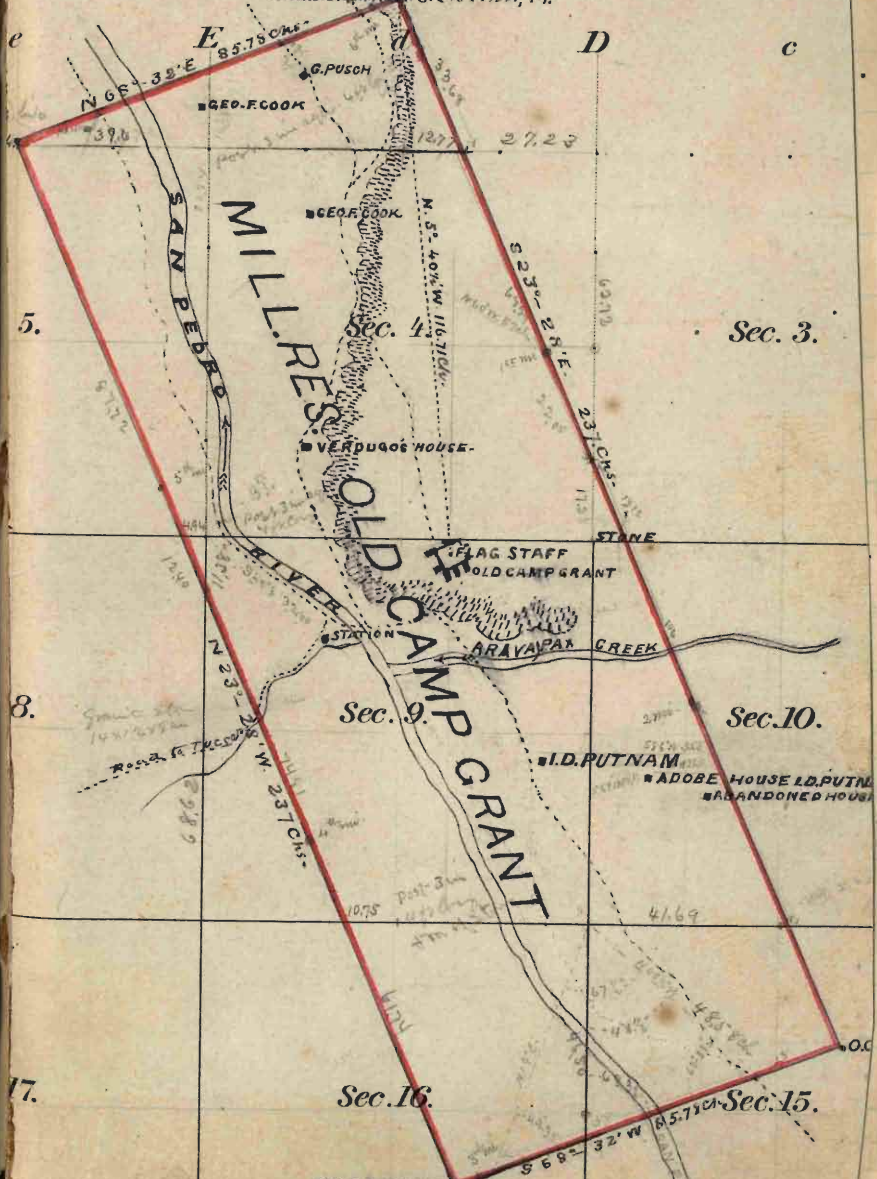

Preliminary to commencing
the survey of the Old Camp Grant
Military Reservation
I try the adjustments of my
Solar Transit and find them
correct

Jan. 7th 1888 at 12 o'clock M
I determine the latitude, by
the Solar apparatus, of the
point where the Old Camp Grant
Flag Staff stood, and find it
to be $32^{\circ} - 51' N.$

Commence at the site of the
old flag staff, which is near
the center of the Parade Ground

 marked by a large stone
 firmly set in the ground

 mound out of stone.

From the site of the old flag-
staff the S.E. cor. of the Parade
ground br. S. $69\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. 302 chs
and the side of the parade
ground extends S. 68° W. from
the S.E. cor. and is 590 chs long.

The remains of old adobe
buildings are yet standing
along the outer limits of
this square but all are
in ruins - in fact nothing

but portions of adobe walls remain standing.

The old cemetery lies $S. 63^{\circ} W.$ about 15 chains from the old flagstaff.

General Description

The Old Camp Gaur Military Reservation extends along the San Pedro River bottom so as to include that portion bet. its N. and S. boundaries.

It also includes a portion of the bottom land along the Arayvaca Creek.

The land along each of these streams is very fertile.

Old Camp Grant Reservation
