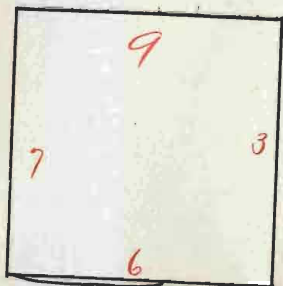

is a pine post 6 ft long, 6x8 ins, with  
a quart of charcoal 12 ins. in the  
ground, marked "N. T. S. S. E. Cor."  
on the side, dug pits 12x12x12 ins.

S. and N. of post 30 ft. dist. Cut  
the letter "H" on rock under the  
center of post, and raised a man-  
nifest of stones 2.5 ft. high, 4 ft.  
base around post.

Windsor Point bears S 34° 24' E,  
16.21 ch. distant.

N.E. Cor. Windsor mining  
claim, Lot No. 37, bears N. 51° 15' E,

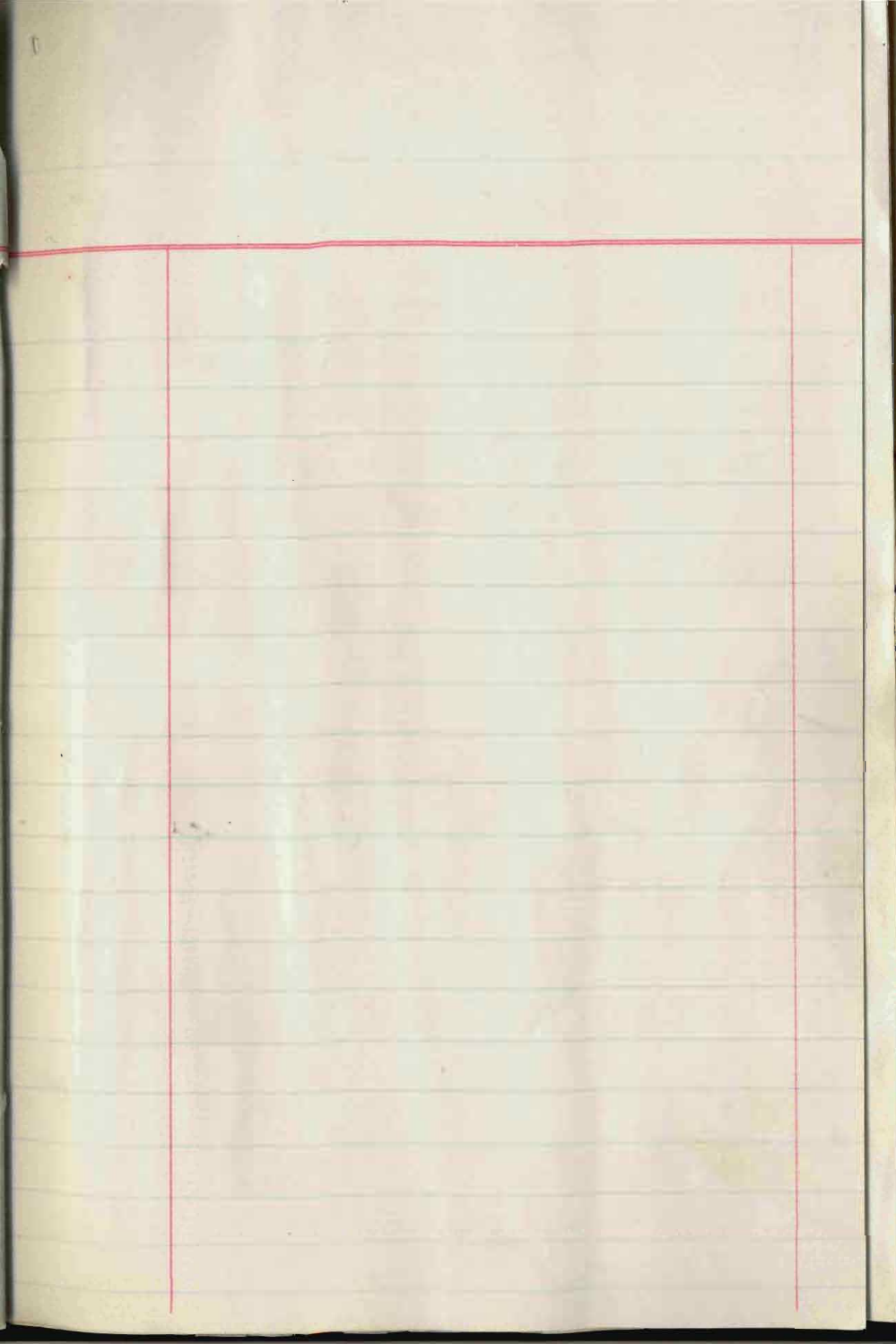
