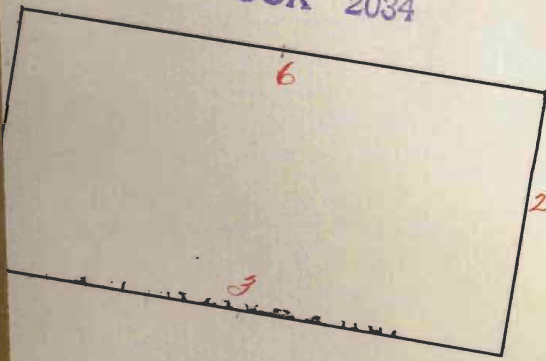

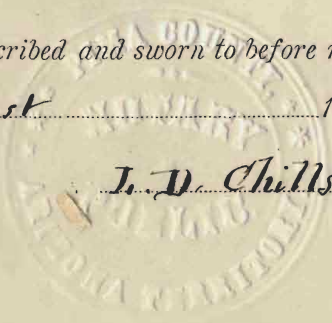

## General description

General surface of the ground is rough and broken; mostly covered with brush, Mesquite, Palo Verde and man-wood. Is nonmineral; and unfit for agricultural purposes.
