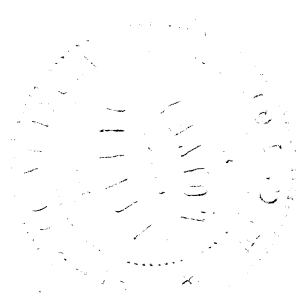

There being but one settler in the N.E. part of Tp. 2 N., R. 14 East, Colin D. Ferguson in Sec. 1, I proceed to survey said section, to enable him to file on his land. Willaim A. Packard's land lies in this sec., although his house is in the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 6, Tp. 2 N., R. 15 E. I leave the approval of this survey for the consideration of the Honorable Commissioner.

August 22, 1906. At 7 a.m., D.m.t., I set off $11^{\circ}59'1''$ N. on the decl. arc and $35^{\circ}32'$ N. on the lat. arc, and determine a true meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, T. 2 N., Rs. 14 and 15 E.

Thence I run,
 West, bet. secs. 1 and 12.
 Over mountainous land, ascending,
 Ridge, extends N. and S., descend through dense brush.
 Gulch, 25 lks. wide, course N.N.E.; begin steep ascent
 over boulders.
 Point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falls on blanket ledge of limestone,
 which I mark with a cross for exact $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., and
 N. of cross, and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor. Pits impracticable.
 From this point west, the line is impracticable to
 survey, therefore I abandon the same.
 Land, mountainous.
 Soil, gravelly, stony and rocky; 3rd and 4th rate.
 Timber, scattering cedar and mesquite; undergrowth,
 mesquite, tesotilla, oak, johava, pale christi, laurel,
 Spanish bayonet and cactus.
 Mountainous land, covered with dense undergrowth,
 exceptionally difficult to survey, 40.00 chs.
