## CHAINS

The east boundary, (Arizona and New Mexico State Line), was surveyed in 1875 by C. Robbins. The south and west boundaries and a portion of the subdivisional lines were surveyed in 1882 by T. F. White. The south boundary was resurveyed in 1906 by C. R. Barthelemy. A portion of the east boundary between the 291 and the 296.59 state line monuments was retraced in 1914 by W. B. Kimmel, who also surveyed the north boundary and completed the survey of the subdivisional lines in the same year. The south 2 miles of the west boundary were resurveyed in 1961-62 by Cazier and Murphy, and the north  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles of the west boundary were resurveyed concurrently with this same group, as described in the field notes of T. 8 S., R. 31 E. The Arizona and New Mexico State Line along the east boundary was resurveyed in 1938 by Everett H. Kimmel and Clark Gumm.

The following field notes are those of a retracement of the east boundary, (Arizona-New Mexico State Line), from the 295 mile post to the 291 mile post, the dependent resurvey of the south boundary and a portion of the subdivisional lines, designed to restore the corners in their true original location according to the best available evidence, and a survey of subdivisions in sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 15 and 30, Township 8 South, Range 32 East, Gila and Salt River Meridian, Arizona.

This survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated December 14, 1967.

Only the true line bearings and horizontal distances for the surveyed lines are given in these notes. Unless described, each corner is monumented with a standard iron post, 30 inches long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches in diameter, flanged at the base, with a brass cap riveted to the top.

The geographic position of the SE. corner of the township, as determined by traverse to U.S.C.&G.S. triangulation station ARIMEX, is: Latitude  $32^{\circ}40'48.5''$  N. and Longitude  $109^{\circ}02'49.8''$  W.

The mean magnetic declination was found to be  $13^{\circ}$  East.
