

This survey is identical with the preliminary survey and listing; I examined the ground carefully and could find no corners or evidence of any corner monuments ever having been established and believe they were never established by the Agricultural Department Survey.

Location.

This claim is located in what will probably be when surveyed Secs.25 and 36,T. $11\frac{1}{2}$ N.,R.10 E.,G.& S.R.Mer., Tonto National Forest, Gila County, Arizona. It lies along Cold Spring Creek covering the bottom land on both sides. The portion described by legal subdivisions is situated in Secs. 30 and 31, T. $11\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 11 E.

Improvements.

A wire fence running from a point on line 4-1,5 chs. from Cor. No. 4, N. 75°W., 15 chs., Thence S. 15°W. 6 chs. to Cold Spring Creek.

This survey is bounded on all sides by unclaimed land in the Tonto National Forest.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations as follows:
