Instrument.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations as follows:-

Oct.13,1910,9 A.M. mountain time; latitude 34°28'N., longitude 111°17' W.from Greenwich.

Set on Cor.No.1, sight on line bearing East by the needle, with variation set 14°30'E. and deflect right

36°28', altitude 30°52'; 37°03', altitude 31°17'.

Quartered the sun. this gives bearing of reference line S.89°50'E. by the average of the four observations and the magnetic variation 14°40'E.
