	Location.
	This survey is located in unsurveyed, but what will probably be Secs. 3, 9 and 10 T. 15 N., R. 2 E. of the Gila and Salt River Baseline Meridian in the Prescott National Forest, Arizona.
	Instrument.
	This survey was executed with a W. and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit equipped with a Burt solar attachment.
	The distances were measured with a 200 and 400 ft. steel tape directly on the slope and the slope angles determined with a clinometer.
	Meridian.
	The courses of this survey were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation on Polaris. Sept. 19, 1913; I set transit at Cor. No. 6 and observe Polaris at E. elong. and mark line on the ground. The next morning I set off the azimuth of Polaris $1^{\circ} 24-1/2'$ to the west of observed line and thus establish the true meridian. I check the meridian thus established from the east.

## Description

This claim lies on the top of Mingus Mountain. The land is rolling, there being very little rough ground. The soil is deep and very fertile and well adapted to raising grains, etc. The claim is heavily covered with young pine growth on that portion not cleared or under cultivation. Water for domestic purposes is supplied by several wells. A system of tanks for conserving floodwater is used for stock, etc. The natural rainfall is depended upon for raising crops. No mineralization is in evidence on claim. No claims of any description known nearby. Dewey, accessible by wagon road is about 15 miles Southwesterly. Jerome, accessible by trail only is located about 4 miles North. The Yaeger Mine is about 3 miles Southwesterly.
