

Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona dated November 29, 1913, and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 132.

Located in what will probably be, when surveyed, secs. 19 and 30, T. 11 N., R. 12 E., and secs. 5 and 8, T. 11 N., R. 11-1/2 E. of the Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, within the Tonto National Forest, Arizona. To be gridded and listed under the Act of June 11, 1906, and survey authorized by other acts of June 11, 1906 and March 4, 1913.

Survey commenced February 25, 1914 and executed with a W. and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit with vertical circle and Burt solar attachment, the least count of all arcs being one minute. The distances were measured with a 400 link steel tape directly on the slope and the slope angles determined with a clinometer.

All the courses of this survey were deflected from the true meridian as determined by observation Polaris.

February 25, 1914. Observe Polaris at Western elongation at cor. No. 89.04 and mark line on ground, the next morning set off 1° 23-1/2' to E. of observed line for true meridian.
