Survey commenced March 5, 1914 and executed with a W.
 and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit with vertical
 circle and Burt solar attachment, the least count of
 all arcs being one minute.

The distances were measured directly on the slope with a
 200 lk. steel tape and the slope angles were determined
 by means of a clinometer.

Claimant also has approximately 22 acres under cultivation, about .5 acres of which is outside of claim.

DESCRIPTION.

This claim lies just below the rim of Tonto Basin and the Mogollon mesa.

The north eastern part of the claim, which is under cultivation is of uniform slope to SE., and the western portion is practically level. The remainder of the land is rough and rocky.

Claim is covered with oak, cedar, juniper and pine timber, there being some merchantable timber on it.

Chains The gulch running through the center of claim runs ~~anisid~~ a stream for part of the year. The natural precipitation is depended upon to raise crops. The claim is chiefly used to raise crops of corn and is apparently more valuable for that purpose than any other. No mineralization was observed or known on claim. No adjoining claims known.

H. E. S. No. 137 Sam Haught, claimant, is situated southeasterly 1-1/2 miles.

Payson, Arizona, the nearest settlement and postoffice is located about 40 miles southwesterly.

No wagon road reaches this claim. A good trail goes to Sam Haught's ranch, and wagon road to Payson.


