3. The corrected figure or fallings take result to nearest link. In calculations of N. and S. areas drop all after second decimal. Surveyors are required to use the Standard Field Tables issued by the G. L. O.

4. Only three copies of this tabulation are necessary, for the District Office, the Surveyor General, and the Commissioner.
