The horizontal limb of the transit has two double verniers placed opposite to each other and graduated to single minutes of arc, which is also the graduation upon the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

I test the adjustments of the transit and solar attachment and make necessary corrections. The stadia wire interval is adjusted to read 1:132.
