GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The claim is located along the narrow valley of Wood Canyon. The greater portion of the land is a sandy loam badly strewn with large wash boulders partially embedded in the ground. The soil appears to be suitable for growing fruit, vegetables, and small grain. There is a scattering growth of sycamore, walnut and ash along the Canyon, and scattering oak and undergrowth of mesquite and catchew on the hill-side.
