

Chains Applicant for listing, R. Lee Parker; Application No. 106 dated April 8, 1908; List No. 3-5 dated January 20, 1909; H. E. No. 022823, made in the Phoenix Land Office on June 24, 1913 by R. Lee Parker.

Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona, dated October 17, 1914, and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 291.

Located in unsurveyed T. 23 S., R. 19 E., G. and S. R. B. and Meridian in what will probably be when surveyed, secs. 18 and 19 within the Coronado National Forest, Arizona.

Surveyed under Acts of June 11, 1906 and June 30, 1914.

Survey commenced February 4, 1915 and executed with a Buff and Buff Forest Service transit No. 9700-6 with vertical circle. The horizontal limb has two double verniers placed opposite to each other, and reads to single minutes of arc which is also the least count of the verniers of the vertical circle.

I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal and were reduced from measurements made on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles are determined with a clinometer.

February 4, 1915.

At cor. No. 3 of the list survey and what will be cor. No. 1 of this survey, I observe the altitude of the sun for azimuth. The reading on the reference object is set at zero and the sun was observed in the lower left and upper right quadrants of the field. My watch shows a true hour and a half.

## DESCRIPTION.

This claim is situated on the head waters of Parker Creek taking in the valleys of two creeks, the Creek entering the claim near cor. No. 1 and flowing through the claim in a southwesterly and then in a northerly direction furnishing living water throughout the entire year. The creek entering the claim near cor. No. 4 furnishes enough water to irrigate a small garden patch.

Water for domestic purposes is obtained from an unimproved spring NW. of the house 1.00 ch. dist.

Note: (This spring furnishes about 1/6 of 1 second foot of water in the driest seasons of the year, and the claimant had material on the ground at the time of this survey to improve the spring, and use any surplus water for irrigation purposes.)

The slopes are stony, non-agricultural and covered with scrub oak.

The timber upon this claim has no value except for fire wood or fence posts, of which there are approximately 500.


