farms it in a very intensive manner. With the exception of the cultivated land, the claim is very rocky and is covered with a dense growth of oak with some pine and juniper interspersed. Sufficient water for domestic and stock purposes is obtained from a spring near the house and from the creek.

This claim is in a mineralized section, but there are no mineral locations within one mile and no patented claims within three miles. I saw no indication of mineral upon the claim.

CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS

There are no conflicts or adjoining claims. H. E. S. 303

lies approximately 1 mile in a Southerly direction from
the survey. Sunnyside post office is one and one-half
