DESCRIPTION: I TOTTE gnisolo

This claim is situated on Joaquin Creek at foot of

. Huachuca Mountains about one, mile from the international boundary line.

The land slopes to south with east and west exposures.

There is no merchantable timber on this tract but there is a small bunch of oak, sycamore and alder in northeastern portion.

Joaquin Creek furnishes sufficient water for domestic use and will furnish water for irrigation a portion of the year.

The tract consists of a strip of bottom land along the creek, steep slopes from bench on west, a very low ridge with gradual slope running through center and a strip of bottom land on east. The bottom land is a rich loam which will produce good crops when irrigated. The low ridge is sandy gravelly loam; tillable and would probably produce crops, if irrigated. The steep slopes on west are rocky and non-agricultural.

There is approximately 22 acres in cultivation.

Parker Canyon, the nearest postoffice is 11 miles west and Nogales, nearest railroad point, is 45 miles west.

Both are reached by good wagon road.

I saw no indication of mineral upon the claim.
