This claim is situated on the E. slope of the Patagonia Mountains at an elevation of approximately 5300 ft. and is valuable for stock raising.

Oak brush on the slopes is the only timber on the claim. Water flows in the arroyo a portion of the time. remainder of the year it is hauled for domestic purposes. 10 ft. in oak brush.

The bottom soil is a sandy loam and produces the ordinary crops of the temperate zone. Good crops of small grains have been produced without irrigation. The mountains immediately West of this claim are mineralized, but no townsites, mining, coal or oil
